TECHNOLOGY TIPS: HOW TO USE ZOOM

Did you know that beginning Spring 2019, <u>Zoom</u> (a video and web conferencing software tool) is integrated into all Canvas courses and is available to all Park University students, faculty and staff. Zoom can also be a useful tool to support teaching and learning to:

- Connect to a guest speaker during class
- hold virtual office hours
- support peer tutoring

- hold class even if the instructor is out of town
- support student group work
- · deliver and evaluate student presentations
- · create assignments within Canvas that utilize Zoom's external tool feature
- · use screen sharing to review with students and give feedback in real time
- · schedule meetings with students that you would normally meet with face-to-face
- catch a meeting in your car (you can sync with Apple CarPlay)

Park University IRB Certification Course Available

The National Institute for Health (NIH) training module is no longer free. Therefore, Park has created an IRB training certification in Canvas for faculty and students. Park's new IRB certification will replace the NIH training requirement, and must be completed in order to submit an IRB application (the certification must also be renewed every two years).
