“If the matter cannot be resolved at that level, an undergraduate student may contact the appropriate Associate Dean or Academic Director to request a formal hearing. The Associate Dean or Academic Director will appoint a Hearing Committee to conduct a hearing within 20 business days.”

“The hearing file will be submitted to the Assistant Vice President for Academic Affairs or Dean of the College for Distance Learning within five business days. Upon receipt, the Assistant Vice President for Academic Affairs or Dean of the College for Distance Learning will scan the appropriate documentation.”

“A student may appeal the decision of the Assistant Vice President for Academic Affairs or Dean of the College for Distance Learning in writing to the Provost and Senior Vice President for Academic Affairs within 72 hours of receipt of the decision.”

level or above. Written or oral examinations may be required for the minor. Curricular concentration for the elementary teacher: Any 21 hours selected from the MA-prefixed courses will suffice. Recommended: MA 110, MA 120, MA 131, MA 210, MA 311, MA 370, MA 406 (Enrichment topics).
